Surveys sent via a unique email link to currently enrolled first year (0-29 credits) and second year (30-59 credits) WNC degree-seeking or university-transfer seeking students.


In addition, high school, Jump Start, personal interest, adult education, or undecided academic plan students were included.

First and second year students were asked the same 40 questions. The survey took approximately 15-20 minutes to complete. Students in target populations received five emails over four weeks with survey links and information about incentive prizes for participation. Two All College emails were sent encouraging faculty and staff to remind students about the survey.

First Year student response rate: 21.7% (297 out of 1,371)

Second Year student response rate: 25.7% (164 out of 638)
